FlatOut Dogs Challenge – Agility



Open to all dogs, all levels. No prequalifying required.

<u>Rules:</u> Competition rules will follow UKI Rules & Regulation.

<u>Judging:</u> Faults converted into seconds <mark>(5 faults = 2 seconds)</mark> and time faults treated the same as course faults but converted on a 1:1 ratio. Refusals will be judged (2 second penalty)

<u>Running Order</u>: Running order will be random. A tie of the final cumulative score will result in a run off.

<u>Winners Prize:</u> The overall winner from each height will receive 50% of the total height's entries.

The other 50% of entries fees will be added to the Ice's Beautiful "Bo" Soul Fund.

Master Series Last Chance

Open to all dogs who have <u>NOT</u> earned a Master Series Final Bye.

Master Series Last Chance consist of 2 rounds, a Jumping Round and an Agility Round. The Last Chance Rounds are for those teams who have <u>not yet earned a Master Series Bye for the 2023 Open Masters Series Final</u>. Only teams without a Master Series bye may enter the Master Series Last Chance.

Earning a bye to progress to the Master Series Final during the Master Series Last Chance, follows the same Canadian Master Series Tournament Rules.

Two ways to earn a bye to the Master Series final:

- 1- Winner of an individual round per height will earn a bye to the Master Series Final
- 2- Overall placement in aggregate results. The number of byes earned will be based on the number of dogs entered in your height.

- 1-5 dogs are entered in a jump height, 1st & 2nd place from the combined scores of Agility and Jumping rounds will earn a bye for the Masters Series Final.

- If 6 – 10 dogs are entered in a jump height 1st - 3rd will earn a bye to the Master Series Final.

- Above 10; 1st – 4th, will earn a bye to the Master Series Final.

There will not be a cash prize for the winners of the Master Series Last Chance. Cash prizes will go directly to the Master Series Final.

Teams who have earned a bye from the Master Series Last Chance heat, will be automatically be entered in the Master Series Final and payment is due on the evening of Thursday, September 7th, 2023.

*US Competitors

You <u>may</u> use a Master Series bye at the Canadian Open. However, your criteria are as follows:

- 1. Enter a Canadian Trial and earn a Master Series bye
- 2. Win an individual Master Series Class, Jumping and/or Agility from a USA Master Series.
- 3. Place overall 1st or 2nd from a USA Master Series.
- 4. Earning a Master Series Bye at a Cup and/or Classic.

Master Series Final – DPF Leading Agility, INC

Open all dogs who have earned a Master Series Final Bye. You must enter in the same height of which your bye was earned, with only one exception. A dog going from a regular height to a select height, not the reverse. Master Series Final consist of 2 rounds, a Jumping Round and an Agility Round.



LEADING AGILITY, INC.

Only teams who have earned a Master Series Final bye may enter. Those team who earn a bye from the Master Series Last Chance will be automatically be entered in the Master Series Final, payment is due on the evening of Thursday, September 7, 2023.

The Master Series Final will follow the Canadian Master Series Tournament Rules, with the exception of earning byes. Winners of the Master Series Final will be crowned the 2023 Canadian Open Master Series Champion and go home with prizes along with the total cash prize collected over the 2022-2023 season, the Master Series Last Chance and the Master Series Final cash prize money. See below for Canadian Master Series Tournament Rules.

Canadian Open Masters Series Rules

The aim of the Masters is to encourage more competitive running in UKI classes and improve the overall standard of top-level agility. The Masters has been created for dogs and competitors whose goal is to compete at both National and International level.

- The Masters is considered one class made up of 2 rounds: an Agility and Jumping round with results combined.
- Entry open to ALL dogs of all levels.
- Separate competition for each jump height.
- Running order for second round will be in reverse order of the first runs results. If a handler has 2 dogs entered within a jump height, they may move their first dog up so that there are as many dogs as possible between their dogs. If this is not possible, they will receive a 6-minute break. If a handler has more than 2 dogs within a jump height and the entry is not large enough for a large enough gap in between all their dogs, the first of their dogs drawn will be allowed to run in between a jump height change is available before their height. If it is not, the final decision will be made by the judge and show manager, taking into consideration fairness to the competitor and other entrants in the Masters Class. Day of Entries must run first within the running orders of the first class. The second class must run in reverse order of placing from first class. Handlers must run for competition in both rounds to receive a combined score and be eligible for the Final, awards & prizes. The dog must run in the height that he will compete at in the Masters Final.
- <u>Cumulative scoring; dog with the lowest score wins. Faults converted into seconds (5 faults = 3 seconds) and time faults treated the same as course faults but converted on a 1:1 ratio.</u>
- In the event of a tie for the combined results, the result from the Agility round will be the deciding factor. If there is still a tie, the dogs will compete in a run-off on the 2nd rounds course.
- Eliminations will result in 100 faults with a 60-second course time.
- Dogs that score 320 cumulative and over will not be placed nor awarded prize money.
- A no-show in either class will result in a disqualification from the class and therefore will not be eligible individual class placement, overall placement or eligibility to qualify for the Final.

Agility Biathlon – Get Dirty Pet Gear

Agility Biathlon, consist of 2 rounds, Agility Round and a Jumping Round.

Open to all dogs, no bye or prequalification required. All dogs entered will run both rounds, a Jumping Round and an Agility Round. The winner of the Biathlon per height, will be named the 2023 Canadian Open Biathlon Champion.

The Agility Biathlon will be judged and scored, as per the UKI Rules and Regulations. All dogs are judged and scored equally at the Novice, Senior and Champion level.

Agility Biathlon is scored as a clean 1st event, with time use only as a tie breaker.



In the event of a tie for the combined results, the result from the Agility round will be the deciding factor. If there is still a tie, the dogs will compete in a run-off on the 2nd rounds course

A no-show in either class will result in disqualification from the Agility Biathlon Championship, including prizes and awards.

Speedstakes Challenge – 4 My Merles Creations

Speedstakes Challenge consist of 2 Speedstakes rounds. Open to all dogs, no bye or prequalification required. All dogs entered will run both rounds, and the winner of the Speedstakes Challenge per height, will be named the 2023 Canadian Open Speedstakes Challenge Champion.

The Speedstakes Challenge will be judged and scored, as per the UKI Rules and Regulations. All dogs are judged and scored equally at the Novice, Senior and Champion level.

Speedstakes Challenge will be scored as a time plus faults event.

Cumulative scoring; dog with the lowest score wins. Faults converted into seconds (5 faults = 5 seconds) and time faults treated the same as course faults but converted on a 1:1 ratio.

In the event of a tie for the combined results, the result from the Speedstakes Round 2 will be the deciding factor. If there is still a tie, the dogs will compete in a run-off on the 2nd rounds course.

Eliminations will result in 100 faults with a 60-second course time.

Dogs that score 320 cumulative and over will not be placed nor awarded prize money.

A no-show in either class will result in disqualification from the Speedstakes Challenge Championship, including prizes and awards.

Games Challenge - Sivret

Games Challenge consist of 2 rounds,

round 1 - Snooker, followed by the final round 2 - Gamblers.

Round 1, Snooker, is open to all dogs without any bye required, however, to progress to the final round 2 Gamblers, you must have progressed through from Round 1, Snooker. The number\percentage of dogs that progress to Round 2, from Round 1, will be decided as entries are finalized. An example of the criteria is, Top 50% or top 10 per height whichever is greater will progress to the final Round 2 Gamblers. Also, those with a Games Challenge Round 2 bye, earned by winning the Pentathlon at a Canadian UKI Classic, will get an automatic entry to Round 2, Gamblers, regardless of their Round 1 score. Teams who are tied at the cutoff criteria will all move on. In the event a percentage of dogs is used to progress through to the next round, decimals will be rounded up.

The winner of the Games Challenge per height, will be named the 2023 Canadian Open Games Challenge Champion.

The Games Challenge will be judged and scored, as per the UKI Rules and Regulations. All dogs are judged and scored equally at the Novice, Senior and Champion level.

Eliminations (dogs not stopping the timers) will score 0 points with a 60-second course time. A no-show in either class will result in disqualification from the Championship including prizes and awards. Cumulative scoring; highest number of points wins with time as tie breaker only. In the event of a tie for the Games Champion, the scores from the Gamblers round will determine the winner. If there is still a tie, the dogs will compete in a run-off on the Gamblers.





UKI Canadian Open National Championship (3 National Rounds)

UKI Canadian Open Championships consist of 3 rounds. Round 1 is a Jumping course, Round 2 & Championship Final Round 3 are Agility courses. The winner of the Championship Final round 3, per height, will be named the 2023 Canadian Open Champion. The National Rounds will be judged and scored, as per the UKI Rules and Regulations. All dogs are judged and scored equally at the Novice, Senior and Champion level. The National Rounds are scored as a clean 1st event, with time use only as a tie breaker. A no-show in either class will result in disqualification from the UKI Canadian Open National Championship, including prizes and awards.

National Round 1 (Jumping)

Open to all dogs who have <u>not</u> earned a bye to round 2 or round 3. The number\percentage of dogs that progress to Round 2, from Round 1, will be decided as entries are finalized. In addition, dog times within a five percentage of the fastest dog's time (within each height category), before faults (no maximum) will also progress to Round 2 (ex: Fastest dog time = 35.123secs, therefore all teams less than or equal to 36.879, will progress to Round 2, independent of number of course faults (knocked bars or refusals). Eliminated dogs do not progress to Round 2 regardless of time.

Example of Progression: top 30% plus all dogs within 5% of the fastest dog's time will move on. (Exact 'top' percentage of dogs that move on will be announced at a later time).

Teams who are tied at the cutoff criteria will all move on. In the event a percentage of dogs is used to progress through to the next round, decimals will be rounded up.

National Round 2(Agility)

Open to all dogs who have either progressed from Round 1 and those with a Round 2 or Round 3 bye. Dogs with a Round 3 bye will run round 2.

Same as Round 1, a set number of dogs will progress from Round 2 through to Round 3 (excluding those team with an Elimination score). Progression to Round 3 will be based on a top percentage of teams (top percentage determined at a later date) plus those teams within a 5% of the fastest dog's time within each height category, as for the progression from Round 1. Teams with a round 3 bye will be excluded from the progression criteria (however these teams can determine/set the fastest dog's time used for progression criteria) and will run in the Championship Final Round 3, regardless of their Round 2 score. Teams who are tied at the cutoff criteria will all move on. In the event a percentage of dogs is used to progress through to the next round, decimals will be rounded up.

Challenger (Agility)

Open to all dogs who have not progressed to the Championship Final Round 3. Either from failing to progress out of Round 1 or 2. The 1st place winner, per height, will progress to the Championship Final Round 3. In the event of a tie, a run off of the Challenger course will decide the winner.

National Final Round 3 (Agility)

Open to all dogs who have progressed through from Round 2, Challenger and those with a Round 3 bye. The winner of the Championship Round 3 will be crowned the 2023 UKI Canadian Open Champion. In the event of a tie, a run off of the National Round 3 course will decide the winner.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

UK Agility International Rules and Regulations apply to the whole event and all people and dogs must comply with these at all times. As a competitor it is your responsibility to be aware of the rules and regulations as they stand at the time of the show. This show will run under the current edition UK Agility International rules found on the UKI web page.

All dogs and handlers must be registered with UK Agility International in order to compete. UK Agility International's official rules & regulations are available to view free on registration of Handler/Owner to UKI. If you or your dog is not already registered, please register online at www.ukagilityinternational.com

Dogs may only compete in one height throughout the whole event. While dogs may also only compete with one handler through the entire event. Handlers who have earned any Byes or pre-qualifications into events for a specific dog, must be the same handler to run that same dog at the Open. If there is a change in handler, all byes and prequalifications will be void and unable to be used. This also applies to jump heights at which byes and prequalification's were received. Exception is the move from regular to select heights.

Competitors through submission of entry acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of **UK Agility International rules and regulations** including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry:

Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible to compete in UK Agility International Trials, with the exception of dogs over 15 calendar months of age eligible to compete in Nursery Classes & Speedstakes.

Entries without fees paid in full will be returned. Separate entry forms must be completed by each Competitor and must be signed by the Competitor or Guardian if the competitor is a minor.

All classes will be run in strict running order. Running orders will be randomly drawn for the first round of each class. Failure to be on the line for your turn will result in an ABS (Absent) score and unable to run that class, which will void the teams placement in aggregate results of the specific event.

Yards per Second (YPS) – The YPS used to calculate Standard Course Times for all Open courses will be set specific to the UKI Open event. The YPS used will likely be above the guidelines in the most up to date UKI Rule Book and what is currently used by judges for all other UKI Trials. This YPS range will be announced leading into the event and/or be available prior to the start of each Open event.

Refund Policy

Entries will not be accepted, changed, or altered after the closing date or capping level has been reached except for the purpose of moving to a higher level. A full refund is available for any membership that is not older than 14 days from the creation of the account date. A full refund is available before the closing date or capping level is met for any show. There will be no cost if refund money is to be left in your UKI account. If a refund is requested, a 5% administration fee for a credit card refund will be assessed, per transaction. *After the closing date, a partial entry may be available for extraordinary circumstances, but this lies with the individual show management based upon their own policies. Contact the show management for details, NOT UKI.*

Payment of entry fees and Instant Account Top up Fees shall be made directly to the UKI member account, or via payment directly to the trial before a competitor may compete. If your UKI account owes money on the closing date, when entries are processed, please be sure you have arranged for payment to be made directly to the show and not latterly paid via your UKI member account. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls to a UK Agility

International account must be paid within 14 days. UK Agility International will suspend a dog's/handlers' registration, until fees are paid in full. Failure to do this will result in your UKI account being suspended.

Additional administration charges may be imposed to members' account due to negligence that result in administration time to correct. Possible infractions, but not limited to are: submitting incorrect trial entry information, including incorrect handler and dog number, creating duplicate membership or dog accounts. Charges are based on an hourly rate of \$20 per hour.

A dog shall be withdrawn from competition without refund if it is: suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, interfering with the safety of any person or other animal or if it is likely to cause itself damage or suffering if it continues competing.

There will be no refunds for entries withdrawn and neither in the event a dog and/or handler is dismissed from the competition, regardless of the reason for dismissal providing this was within accordance of UK Agility International rules and regulations.

It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Handlers working more than one dog in a class **must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn**. Failure to do so will result in elimination.

All dogs are entered at this show at their owners' risk and whilst every care will be taken the show management and UKI will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury however caused to dogs, persons or property whilst at the show.

It is expressly understood that **Competitors alone are responsible** for the behavior of their dogs, children and guests. Any competitor whose dogs, children, or guests create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior, may at the discretion of the show management, be asked to remove the offending dogs, children, guests from the event grounds. No refunds of fees will be made in such a case.

Dogs left in hot cars, or dogs appearing to be in distress, will be dealt with as seen fit by the Show Management.

Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge, the show management reserves the right to appoint another judge. Should circumstances so dictate the show manager, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to UK Agility International. In the event of abandonment of the show through circumstances beyond our control, the SHOW MANAGEMENT may defray such expenses from the entry fee to cover the cost of the show preparation. These accounts will then be made public.

<u>Media Rights Release:</u> Through the entry into this event, all competitors grant to UKI and its affiliated companies, representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog's name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media known now or in the future. Further, I hereby release UKI and its affiliates, representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right.

Rules of Conduct: UKI promotes dog agility pursuant to regulations consistent with international standards as a competitive, spectator sport. All competitors, officials, and event personnel shall conduct themselves in a professional and sportsmanlike manner consistent with the foregoing statement of purpose and seek to uphold, and enhance where possible, the image of the sport and UKI through such conduct and actions. Each competitor acknowledges through their entry to the UKI event that their participation is a privilege and not a right. By virtue of their entry, competitors acknowledge and agree to comply with all UKI rules and regulations, and agree to accept any sanctions that may be imposed for failure to comply. The judge has responsibility for determining when it is appropriate to excuse a dog and competitor from the ring based on matters related to competitor misconduct. The UKI show officials have responsibility for determining when an infraction should result in expulsion of a competitor, dog, or any person from the event by conducting the procedure outlined in the UKI rule book. UKI head officials, through further investigation, may impose sanctions including suspension or expulsion from future events.

The following is a partial list of infractions on which the judge or UKI officials may take action: Abuse of a dog on the grounds \Box Actions that may have the appearance of abuse of a dog \Box Willful misconduct or interference with a competitor's right to show \Box Any acts of poor sportsmanship \Box Violation of procedural rules \Box Compulsive, correctional training on the grounds \Box Willful misrepresentation on entry forms \Box Willful misrepresentation of animals \Box Dog aggression \Box Failure to exercise diligence in the control of the behavior of their dog. \Box Intimidation and/or impolite confrontation of judges, event officials, event helpers, or other competitors \Box Creating excessive delays as a failure to respect the authority of event officials.

Social Media Conduct rule is in effect. Cyber bullying of any kind towards UKI, competitors, judges, helpers or volunteers will not be tolerated. Examples of cyber bullying include but are not limited to, communications that seek to intimidate, manipulate, falsely discredit, put down, try to control, rudely confront, demand, and comments that try to incite further issues. Further, UKI is committed to maintaining an environment that is built on mutual respect and is free from racism, discrimination and harassment. In keeping with this goal, any behavior that is hateful towards race, color, religion, creed, national origin or ancestry, ethnicity, sex, and gender will not be tolerated. Any of these cases may sanction removal from all associated social media pages and even lead to expulsion of UKI events and even further expulsion of organization membership.
